International Reach and Influence	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> § WIE National Committee to host the International Conference for Women Engineers and Scientists in Adelaide on 19-22 July 2011 (ICWES15 2011), the first time such a conference will be held in Australia. Promotional postcards distributed at conferences in Brasil, Europe, USA and Africa. BHP Billiton is the major sponsor. § An article on 2007 - The Year of Women in Engineering will be featured in the first UNESCO World Report on Engineering. § Papers on National Committee projects to attract and retain women engineers presented at WEC 2008 Brasilia Brazil in December 2008 and WFEO WIE meeting in Kuwait Nov 2009. § WIE is a member of the International Network of Women Engineers and Scientists (INWES). § WIE has a representative on the WFEO Standing Committee on Women in Engineering, meetings held Dec 2008, Nov 2009.
