

- Positive Operating Cash flows faster renewals in June 2022
- Strong Balance Sheet:
  - Net assets increased due to operating surplus
  - \$58m cash (including \$32m in prepaid income)
  - \$20m held in property
  - \$26m invested through Morgan Stanley
- Auditor (Ernst & Young): unqualified audit opinion


