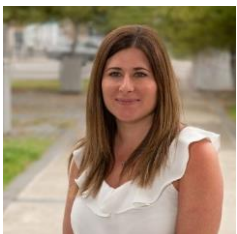
**Clara Laydon, Senior Engineer, Hunter H2O**
